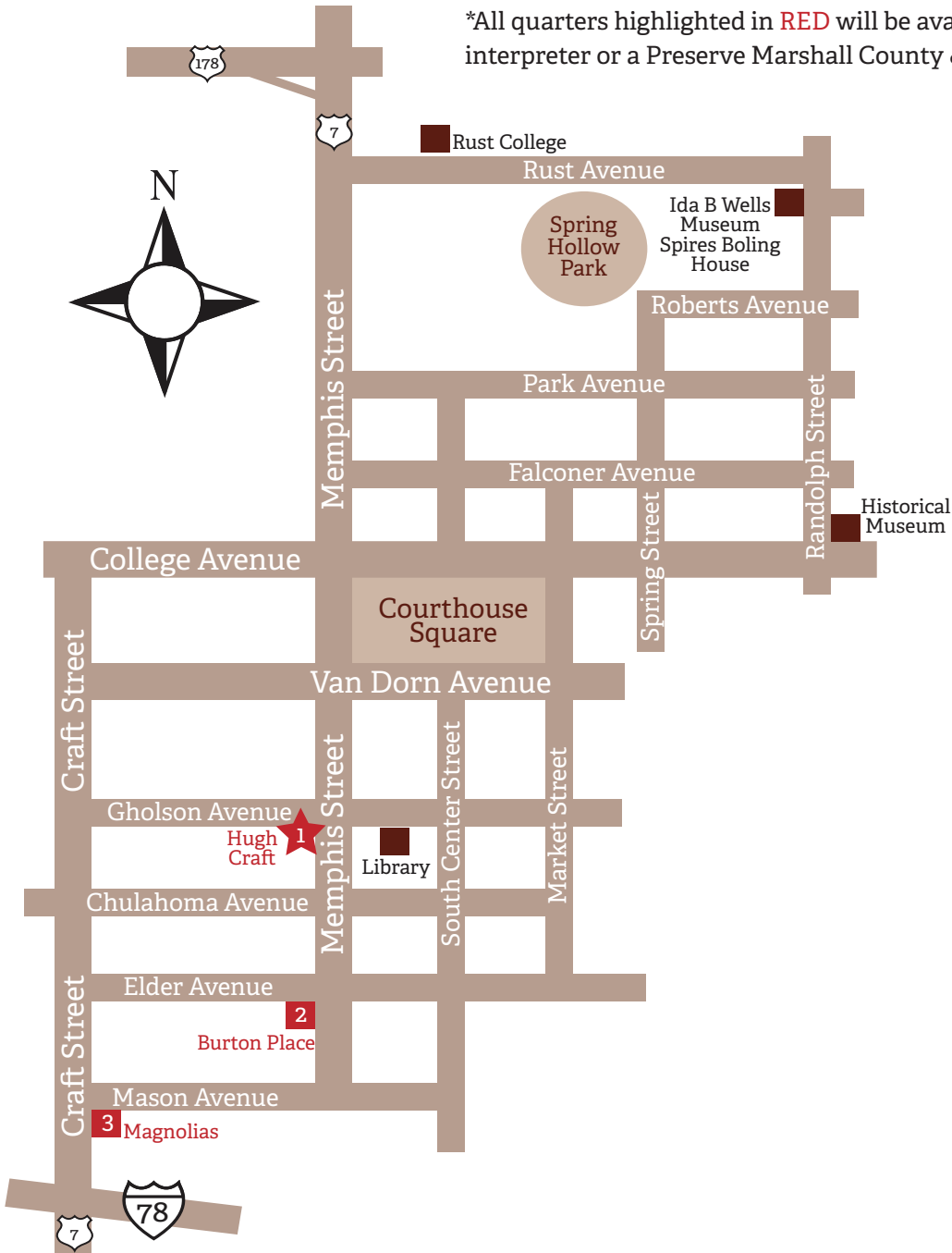




BEHIND the BIG HOUSE tour

*All quarters highlighted in **RED** will be available to tour during the entire Pilgrimage and led by either an historic interpreter or a Preserve Marshall County & Holly Springs, Inc. volunteer docent.



1. Hugh Craft House (1851) – 184 S. Memphis Street
Slaves' quarters and detached kitchen (ca. 1843) on site, originally built for an earlier home on this site and retained by Mr. Craft for the use of his slaves. In a preserved state and built of heavy-timber frame with batten-board siding.



2. Burton Place (1842) – 248 S. Memphis Street
Slaves' quarters and detached kitchen, built of brick masonry with three rooms en tandem; in a preserved state.



3. Magnolias (1852) - 305 Craft Street
Slaves' quarters and detached kitchen are heavily rebuilt in modern interior/exterior renovations and further obscured by later built-over house extensions.
